WHY DO WE DO GODSPELL? By Virginia Eschman

This article is a continuing tribute written by Virginia to honor GODSPELL and its many years of service and song on behalf of the youth at FirstChurch. Its outstanding leadership, parental, church clergy and member support, and ministry to youth and church membership throughout the United States has offered all of us a rich historical and musical blessing. GODSPELL is retiring this year. Their final performance will be at the RIVERSTAGE JUNE 6.


- Fund Raising Each tour participant pays much of their own way. FUMC has been very generous in helping the youth earn money to pay for tour. The youth have sold meat, sold flowers at Christmas and in the spring, washed cars, put on 'Spirit Renewed' shows with FUMC members paying for tables, held silent auctions of items they have made and probably lots of other things. Thank you for your support!
- Scripture In addition to learning the parables, each tour participant has to recite scripture to retrieve any of their items turned in to 'lost and found' (Tony) on tour. Considering that most of the script is scripture, it's amazing how much scripture disappears from your brain when you're trying to get that item back.
- Leadership Each youth takes on more roles the more years they go on tour. These roles go from being 'piggies' as 7th graders to singing solos and duets and telling stories as they get older. They go from cleaning the bus to being on the Sound Team or the Hospitality Team in later years. They also take on leadership roles helping to teach the younger cast members the songs, choreography and stories.
- Missions 'Godspell' tour is considered a mission tour. An offering is taken during the song 'All Good Gifts' which is given to some mission that the current cast members agree to. For many years this offering was sent to the 'Container Church' in Oranienburg, Germany to support the early growth of that church which was one of our main sponsors to the Berlin area. Participants visited Travis Park UMC in San Antonio one year to observe and participate in one of their missions by feeding the homeless. After year 15, the youth took a break from tour for one year and went on a mission trip to Colorado.
- Creativity 'Godspell' is different every year at FUMC. Each cast puts their own 'flavor' into the stories. One of my favorites is the year that the 'piggies' were 'kitties.' Tony really lets them be flexible in how they change things from years past.
- Talent We have had many talented youth involved in 'Godspell' over the past 25 years. Some of the boys played an instrument and only wanted to be in the band. That was not an option. They all ended up with some part in a story and really did a great job with their newly acquired acting skills. We have had several cast members in the band playing instruments including drums, guitar, mandolin, flute, recorder, horn, tuba, cello, violin, and keyboard. We've also had several ballerinas perform and some of the girls doing sign language. Of course, there are all the solos, duets, choruses, choreography, and stories. Each cast member over the years has shown their own talents in their own way.
- History There is always some sort of historical aspect to tour. Our youth have been everywhere from NASA Space Camp to the Capitol, Lincoln Memorial and Smithsonian in Washington D. C. to Sachsenhausen Concentration Camp and a salt mine in Germany to the Air Force Academy. One year Brian May gave us a history lesson about the King Ranch as we were driving through the King Ranch. **TO BE CONTINUED – JUNE**

Building Handicap Ramps Texas Ramps Project Partnership

First UMC continues to work alongside the Texas Ramps Project to provide ramps, free of charge, for local homes in need. Each month on the third Saturday, a team gathers to build a ramp. Some of the ramp modules are prepared in advance, which saves time the day of the build. There's a small group that prepares those during the week. Another facet to this project is the interviewing of the residents and the design process of the ramp. The people who do that are called Surveyors. Volunteers are needed for all three of these efforts: building ramps, building modules in advance, and being a Surveyor. For the Love of Kids CPS/FUMC Partnership News

The partnership between Child Protective Services (CPS) and First UMC continues to evolve. Meeting the dinner needs of children under CPS care has been our primary focus, and our team has responded well to that need. However, the focus is changing now due to a home becoming available for these kids in a neighboring town.

The kids have been housed primarily at the CPS office and meals were dropped off there each night. This home is a huge blessing, as it has a yard and is close to a park – much more suitable for children than a downtown office. However, the distance means we will not be providing nightly dinners right now.

The team provided supplies to help stock the home, and the church is providing some of the groceries each week. Unfortunately the home is only available temporarily. What is desperately needed is a long-term home situation in San Angelo. *Please pray for this to happen*, or if you know someone with a vacant home that might be interested in talking with CPS about that, please let us know.

Finally, if you feel led to contribute financially to this ministry, your money will be used to purchase groceries and to assist with any special requests for these kids. Please send donations to the church marked *CPS Care Portal*. FMI contact Sherrie Walker in the Church Office.




First Fridays @ Soup Kitchen Serve Date: <u>MAY 7</u>
