Dr. Dewey Whitwell both ministers for The Evangelical United Brethren Church (EUB). Dr. Whitwell was once a EUB Conference Superintendent and Conference Evangelist. Rev Ernest Bradford was a vocational barber and preacher.

I'm pretty sure if the preaching didn't convict you, as a young boy I was certain his "razor strap" would (f you know what I mean!) I am who I am because of these men, fathers and grandfathers and I am grateful!




# Rev. Kristie Crisp - Directing Ministries Pastor

Reflecting on the uncertainty of the world over the past weeks, months, and even years, there are two important things I hold close...two truths I learned from a wise Christian man: "God is always with us" and "look for the lesson." No matter the circumstances, you can always learn something, even from the bad ones. This wise Christian man was my Papa, Rev. John D. Withoff. Long before he dedicated his life to the Methodist Church to become a pastor, he was called Brother John because everyone who encountered him, encountered the love of Christ. One would think my memories of my Papa would be limited since he passed away from an unexpected heart attack when I was only 2 ½ years old, but my memories far exceed that short time he was physically in my presence. Through my Granny and my mom, through my aunts and uncles, I had so many memories and lesson that in my heart he has been with me, even to this day. In March of 2016, as I baptized a beautiful little baby girl for my first time, I knew God was with us and I felt my Papa's large hand on top of mine as I placed it on her head in the name of the Father, and still there, in the name of the Son, and still, in the name of the Holy Spirit. It was if he was still guiding me and passing on important things he wanted to share with me.

When the day is difficult and things make no sense, I stop and thank God for never leaving me and then I feel my Papa reminding me, "look for the lesson". Many times, the lesson is not what we expect but rather it is how we can do better or if we were hurt by someone, how we can make sure we don't cause or inflict the same pain on another. I am so blessed and so thankful for the amazing man God place in my life! I pray in every circumstance you too will remember: "God is with us" & "look for the lesson."



My dad was a most talented and loving man. He played every instrument (apart from the harp), had a crystalclear tenor voice, exercised his sense of humor daily and absolutely loved my mom and his family. We used to tease him that he never took out the trash unless he kissed mom goodbye first. While that was probably an exaggeration, it wasn't by much!

He loved being in the ministry and seeing the transformation of lives from being broken, abandoned, or aimlessly lost to seeing how lives were restored when they encountered the love and lavish grace of God. That love for restoration carried over to his hobbies as well. Just because something was shattered didn't mean it had to stay that way! He found demolished pieces of antique cars and made them into beautiful automobiles that turned heads wherever he went. He re-claimed scraps of violin parts, formed them in the oven and made them into beautiful instruments of praise. Playing "Amazing Grace" with him on beautiful violins that had been restored on his workbench were recurring memories I will cherish all my life.

Attached is one rusted frame that was literally buried behind a barn in Southern California. It became a popular "limo" once it was restored. Couples would sit in the rumble seat and ask him to drive them around town after their weddings. Previously broken, yet renewed and able to serve and bring joy again. Isn't that the ongoing story of our redemption in God's love?

I am so thankful for his faithful service to the Lord, his love for the congregations he served, and his willingness to be a channel of God's grace freely given to one and all.




## **Recalling 50 Years of Daddy**
