# **BLESSINGS FROM PASTOR SCOTT BRADFORD**



I woke to news of another shooting. My immediate thought – The world needs Jesus!" Times are tough, but the tough in Christ gets tougher (more faith). Ephesians 4:1-2 are some words for us to live by "As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle; be

patient, bearing with one another in love." As I think about these words, they are a way for us to live despite the swirling out of control world! Recently our Bishop Robert Schnase said, "Pastor's, I need you to be less anxious than your congregation!" And I would add to that "Congregation we need to be less anxious than the world!" We need to bring grace to tension filled moments! We need to bring the light of Jesus to the midst of darkness! Hope to those who are feeling hopeless!

There is a story told "Once upon a time, there was an old man who used to go to the ocean to do his writing. He had a habit of walking on the beach every morning before he began his work. Early one morning, he was walking along the shore after a big storm had passed and found the vast beach littered with starfish as far as the eye could see, stretching in both directions.


Off in the distance, the old man noticed a small boy approaching. As the boy walked, he paused every so often and as he grew closer, the man could see that he was occasionally bending down to pick up an object and throw it into the sea. The boy came closer still and the man called out, "Good morning! May I ask what it is that you are doing?"

The young boy paused, looked up, and replied "Throwing starfish into the ocean. The tide has washed them up onto the beach and they can not return to the sea by themselves," the youth replied. "When the sun gets high, they will die unless I throw them back into the water." The old man replied, "But there must be tens of thousands of starfish on this beach. I'm afraid you won't really be able to make much of a difference."

Before you act, remember what Jesus said: 'I tell you the truth, when you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you were doing it to me!' Matt. 25:40.

May you use your freedom to love God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. And...the second is just as important, love your neighbor as yourself. Let's be the 'Church' God has called us to be- Let's be God's love in action today and every day.






