

#### BLESSINGS FROM PASTOR SCOTT BRADFORD

#### A few things!

Construction is beginning SOON on the Lake View Lighthouse Commercial Kitchen project (Phase 1)! I hope we will be done by November-ish!

The Kid's Eat Free program at Lake View Light House, though we temporarily partnered with Oasis Baptist for a location has been a huge success! Thanks to Cyndi Harper, Dana Bollinger and all the volunteers. We served about forty children some days.

We had our LOI (Letter of Intent) approved by Methodist Healthcare Ministries, and we are now in the "application" process. Hopefully, we will acquire a grant towards Phase II which is estimated at \$70,055 to renovate restrooms and add showers for mission purposes. Thank you, Pastor Kristie Crisp, for your hard work in submitting the LOI.

UGH! We did have to do about \$11,000 in asbestos mitigation, but it is now complete! Thank you, Endowment Committee, for helping us with this unexpected cost.

The Kid's Clothing Closet in partnership with Goliad Elementary at Lake View Lighthouse will be up and running by the time School starts! Thanks to Lauren Bradford, her team, and all of you for your generous donations!

On the Lake View Lighthouse Phase 1 remodel we are currently on track of the estimate with about \$12,000 to spare, but I imagine this will be eaten up in some unexpected construction costs. A 10% cost overrun would be about \$15,000 so if you are looking for something to contribute to beyond the budget and any remaining, I'm sure will go towards Phase II.

This morning I was looking at the Costa Rica mission team pictures building the foundation for a parsonage and hosting a mini-VBS, I thought to myself "What amazing work! Thank you, Karee Wiggans and team!"

I'm loving the start of our sixth year together!

With such a busy and vibrant church, it is easy for us to go in several different directions all at the same time. . . which can make us feel a bit disconnected from one another. Even in our busyness, in our summer travels, in our beautiful diverseness, God still calls us to be connected in a very specific way in John 15:5. "I am the vine; you are the branches. . ." It is crucial we stay in connection to one another through direct connection to our Savior, Jesus Christ. We learn even more about what happens when we stay connected to Christ and

one another and when we don't.

John continues in Verse 6 ". . . If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned." We bear fruit when we remain in Christ. We bear the fruit of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. (Gal. 5:22-23)

Isn't this what we want for one another? Isn't this what we want for our church? Isn't this what we want our church to be known for? Isn't this what is needed to be God's Kingdom builders? No matter how busy, how diverse, how far, or how stretched we become, we must stay connected to Christ, to the vine.

We are called to be fruit bearers, to be Christ-bearers, to be One body. For as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and all were made to drink of one Spirit. For the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would be the sense of hearing? If the whole body were an ear, where would be the sense of smell? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many parts, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you," nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you."

On the contrary, the parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and on those parts of the body that we think less honorable we bestow the greater honor, and our unpresentable parts are treated with greater modesty, which our more presentable parts do not require. But God has so composed the body, giving greater honor to the part that lacked it, that there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together; if one member is honored, all rejoice together. Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it.

I pray that in your busyness that you do your part to remain connected to the vine...that you encourage your brother and sister in Christ to remain connected to the vine. I pray that together, we bear an abundance of fruit for God's Church.
