I cannot put into words what I experienced at the New Room Conference. I guess it was like Emmaus on steroids. That being said, instead of a Saturday moment, I had a Saturday moment every couple hours.

I cried; I worshipped; I sang for joy, and I encountered a living loving God who was powerfully present. I was forgiven and renewed!

I won't say too much about some of the sessions, because they likely will all be included in some messages that will occur within the next six months or so as I can work them in.

One powerful thing I want to talk about and have already been involved with is the movement to be in a "band" or "class meeting" to hold each other accountable.

I will soon be working with Sherrie Walker to put bands together and will use "Discipleship Bands – a practical field guide," by Mark Benjamin with J.D.Walt.

A band might be like an Emmaus reunion group, but I would say focusing more on accountability, and with open honesty and trust of confidence (though both are similar). Benjamin writes "While we cannot claim Jesus had a band, we do believe he modeled the kinds of relationships that are vital to become deep and whole persons."

I have been in a band with fellow Presiding Elders and am currently leading a band of local area clergy. Rev. Dr. Leah Hidde-Gregory says these groups for clergy are "mandatory." In my own experience, it is I am finding accountability helpful, and I know that am not pastoring in isolation.

I pray you will begin to consider forming a band of 3-4 people, or joining one, as we begin to be in discipleship with each other. Please watch for more details soon, or if you have a group that would like to form, please let us know.

Hello church!

Scott and I just returned from a conference late last week in Houston known as New Room (newroomconference.com). It is light years ahead of anything else I've ever attended. This was my 4th New Room, Scott's first. I cannot encourage it highly enough. Perhaps we can take a team next year (location is TBD).

The worship and teaching was top notch as usual but perhaps even more special than years past as God showed up BIG on Friday. Scott already mentioned this in his sermon yesterday and I will be as well in the future. There are many Scriptures I could reference regarding this outpouring, but perhaps, for me, Romans 8:26 is most appropriate:

"In the same way, the Spirit comes to help our weakness. We don't know what we should pray, but the Spirit himself pleads our case with unexpressed groans."

We were in the middle of hearing from a panel about the Asbury outpouring in February in Hughes Chapel (a place I dearly love) and a young black man was describing the Spirit coming to him the day before the outpouring during a Black History Month event. It's a long story...but he began to sing (at New Room), "Lift Every Voice and Sing..." As Scott said, "I don't really have words for what happened next. Suffice it to say that God came and rested at the Woodlands Methodist Church for an hour or two that I can't really remember. It was glorious."

My overall takeaway is simply confirmation God cares deeply about his creation, about us, and about **YOU.** Whatever injustices you have faced or are facing, God is present, and nothing goes unnoticed by him. Praise God!

ROAD TRIP TO FT. MCKAVETT OCTOBER 22ND

The church at Ft. McKavett was funded by a Catholic foundation from New York in their efforts to provide churches out here in the west. The construction was done by local families who lived in the Ft. McKavett area and

served the community until the mid-1980s.

In 2007, David & Judith Hirschfeld purchased the land and the little church bordering their ranch. They determined to rebuild the facility to honor the many past parishioners who lived, worshiped and attended St. Williams Catholic Church while making Ft. McKavett their homestead.

There was meticulous work done on this historical building under the initial guidance and creative suggestions from Howard Taylor, the museum curator for the San Angelo Museum of Fine Arts. A woman from Junction came to deliver the original fourteen Stations of the Cross that had been mounted on the walls at the time the church was built and used for worship throughout the years.

The renovations are absolutely beautiful! New stained-glass windows were created, and a small kitchen and restrooms have been added behind the sanctuary and include a large covered area with outdoor fireplace and seating.

On October 22nd we will have a **Road Trip** from the church parking garage out to Ft. McKavett to enjoy a time of fellowship in the Community Building across the street from the Chapel and then a wonderful old-fashioned Hymn Sing in the Chapel at 5:00 pm. By 6:00 we will make our return trip to San Angelo. It will be a delightful day of fellowship, inspiration and savoring the faithfulness of God to us all through the years.
