

Updates and The New Year

Discipleship Bands – Please come for an informational breakfast January 13th at 8am. "A discipleship band is a group of 3-5 people (of the same sex) who read, pray, and meet together to become the love of God for one another and the world." Its intent is to strengthen your accountability to be a disciple and deepen your faith. I pray you will want to join one.

Lake View Lighthouse – Another grant has been awarded (\$84,000) for Phase III and Program Grant from Methodist Healthcare Ministries (MHM). We need your help and willingness to serve as we implement new programs and maintain those started in 2023. Programs include Lighthouse Kids Eat Free, Afterschool program, Food pantry, Mobile Clinics, Nutritional Classes, Kids Clothing Closet, and more.

W.O.R.D. Challenge – more details coming January 14th in worship!

Tammy Ma (Christmas offering) – You have donated \$3,160 to help Tammy Ma be reunited with her orphans she hasn't seen in two years since being expelled from India. I hope to have pictures and details of the reunion soon.

Mid-Texas Conference (MTC) – The MTC recently gave a \$1,000 rebate on connectional giving for both Rev Jim Noble as Treasurer and for my role as Presiding Elder for Covenant Area #11. A \$2,000 thank you to the congregation for supporting us in this extra work of which we volunteer. In 2024, the MTC is offering a \$25,000 rebate off our connectional giving to offset the work Jim does as Treasurer. Our previous apportionments were \$145,000 and our new connectional giving was going to be about \$52,000 and with this rebate, it will only be about \$27,000(Ish).

Same Great Church – We are 6 months into being First Methodist Church, a GMC Congregation, and I know it has been a hard year for all, but I want to affirm we are the same great church. As we continue to be loving in hope to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ, we have continued each ongoing ministry and are on the move to begin new ones. In 2023, we took in seventy-one new members (the largest growth in my seven years here) and twelve baptisms. Financially we have had a good year and are looking towards exciting ministries in 2024. My soul is blessed when I see our church helping people. Examples are:

- 20,000 pounds of food donated from Wall ISD to help us reach the underserved.
- Shannon Business office collected a truckload of coats & blankets to distribute.
 When pulling up to the church with the load, Candis and I encountered a woman walked up needing a coat. Somebody's Rusty remains a vital ministry.
- Our work to help MLK restroom project and the recent partnership with Garden the Gethsemane raised over \$11,777 to repair their foundation.
- Costa Rica Mission Team continues to build and is now helping lead the way in Mid-Texas Conference.
- Lighthouse Kids Eat Free served 1,000 meals this past summer.
- · Our recent hosting an Inter-faith Hanukkah and Menorah Lighting Service.
- Nearly every month we build a ramp in the Texas Ramp Project.
- · Growth in Childrens and Youth ministry and more

Same Great Church making a difference in God's Kingdom. Celebrate what has been accomplished let us also pour more into the Kingdom work because of a hurting world. The world needs the love of Jesus that we can offer through First Methodist Church!

I praise your Holy name, O God




A new choral group (The S.T.E.R. class)
