I want to write you about some upcoming things:

72-hour Prayer Reading: From 7:00 a.m. on Thursday March 28th (Maundy Thursday) through right before church on Easter morning March 31st, in the Chapel.

In Scripture, Paul told Timothy "Until I come, devote yourself to the public reading of Scripture, to preaching and to teaching. Do not neglect your gift, which was given to you through prophecy when the body of elders laid their hands on you." (1 Timothy 4:13-16)

At a previous congregation and another one I visited, I took part in a 72 Hour public reading through the Bible which will occur during Holy Week and bring us right up to Easter morning. Churches are usually good at public reading for sermons on Sunday morning, or Bible Studies but don't really publicly read the Scriptures much except short excerpts.

I invite you to be a part of public reading where we will begin with Genesis and in 72 hours read all the way through revelation leading right up to Easter morning. In Dripping Springs in the early morning on Sunday when we were nearing the ending of the reading, people who had previously read just randomly arrived early and when we were near the 21st Chapter of Revelation, I looked around and people were standing. I have chills now writing about it. The Word of God matters to us, and we should hear it read!

Band Meeting or Class Meetings: Going "deeper" in your faith: In her pre-Conference report President Pro Tempore Rev. Dr. Leah Hidde-Gregory writes:

"In 2024, we are going to be focused on Accountable Discipleship. It is a key distinctive in the Global Methodist church. A disciple is a person whose life reflects the character of Christ and extends the mission of Christ in holy love of God and neighbor. The disciple's character and practice are informed by the scriptures, nurtured by the community of faith, and empowered by the Holy Spirit. The Goal of accountable discipleship ministry in the Global Methodist Church is to create communities that make, develop, and nurture disciples of Jesus Christ where each person is invited, challenged, supported, and held lovingly accountable to living sanctified lives that reflect the practices, character, and mission of Christ."

It is important that we find Bible studies and band meetings or reunion groups that hold us accountable and take us deeper in our faith. May we have a blessed 2024 as I continue to challenge myself, and you, to **be in the WORD: Witness;**Outreach; Reaching in; and Deepening your faith.

Hello Church!

If you regularly attend 11th hour, this may be repetitive, but if you don't, I've been preaching an apologetics type of series about the impact Christianity has made on the world. There is an all-too-common narrative out in our culture that Christians are somehow the problem. The thinking among believers in this narrative is something along the lines of, "If we could just get rid of Christianity, Jesus, and religion, we'd have utopia (not the Utopia in Texas, we already have that). Nonsense.

The overwhelming evidence is Christianity, while not perfect, has been a remarkably positive force in history. I've been using the book, How Christianity Changed the World, by Alvin Schmidt, as a guide through the series. Christianity has had tremendous positive impact in areas such as the sanctity of life, the rights of women, charity & compassion, healthcare, education, labor, science, liberty, art, music, and many other areas.

Though facts and history certainly support the positive impacts of our faith, we must always act lovingly and not aggressively. If you come across someone espousing the nonsense cultural narrative, you can certainly defend the faith...but lovingly. Some people are simply averse to facts anyway and nothing can help that except God & prayer.

I know a man, I'll call him Billy, from Emmaus, who is a retired coach & educator. He was quite a coach, having multiple state champions and state championship teams at the 6A level. He also loved teaching. But he was probably best described as an agnostic. One of his longtime fellow coaches, a Christian, invited Billy to dinner at his family's house. Billy showed up, was introduced, and one of the kids in the house said, "Wait, is this the Billy we've been praying for every day for years?" Yes, it was. Billy is now a deeply devoted follower of Christ, praise Jesus.

On another note, I'm trying a new class on Wednesday nights for those, like me, who adore all kinds of music. We're meeting in the office conference room, I believe. See the rest of this newsletter for more details. Come check it out!

Back story - Atheist turned Christian
