#### Help us make the 72 Hour Bible Reading a powerful time in the life of our church by signing up for one and or both of the following:

- 1) Sign up you and your family to read at least for a twenty-minute increment.
- You can have your children read.
- You can sign up as a family.
- You can also sign up for multiple times and days.
- Each person reads for about twenty minutes then hand it off to the next reader.

We will be asking you to sign the book where you start reading in the margins of the book.

2) We also need Team captains to cover a two-hour shift to make sure that the reading transitions smoothly and there are readers in place.

#### NIGHTTIME Security and Entry:

- From 7pm to 7am the doors will be locked, and entry will be gained on the Oak Street Sanctuary Door (just North of the Chapel door).
- If you need handicap accessibility, that can be gained by the door from the alley after letting the person tending the door know.
- During the day handicap entry can be gained by entering the Chapel door from the alley where the ramp comes up.

#### This will be a powerful experience.

Revelation 1:1-3 instructs us: "The revelation from Jesus Christ, which God gave him to show his servants what must soon take place. He made it known by sending his angel to his servant John, who testifies to everything he saw—that is, the word of God and the testimony of Jesus Christ. <u>Blessed is the one who reads aloud the words of this prophecy, and blessed are</u> <u>those who hear it and take to heart what is written in it</u>, because the time is near."

In this 72 Hour Bible Reading, we will both read and hear, and I trust be blessed!

# **REV. JIM NOBLE – Associate Pastor**

Hello Church!

Well, an interesting year is upon us, and it is a leap year! This will be my 13<sup>th</sup> leap year. So, some might say, the people who were born Sunday, February 29, 1976, turn 13 this year! I wondered what the Bible said about leaping and rediscovered this text from Luke 6:22-23 (CEB):

Happy are you when people hate you, reject you, insult you, and condemn your name as evil because of the Human One. Rejoice when that happens! Leap for joy because you have a great reward in heaven. Their ancestors did the same things to the prophets.

When was the last time you leapt with joy? When was the last time you leapt with joy because you have a great reward in heaven? I remember leaping as a kid a lot more than I have leapt as an adult. Of course, part of that is because leaping is now a health hazard.

What kinds of things make me leap now? Well, when the Chiefs won their third championship in five years, I kind of leapt. In comparison with this text, it seems silly to leap for such a thing. But I have also leapt (at least spiritually) at the New Room Conference, our combined worship, our conference awakening, during 11<sup>th</sup> hour worship, etcetera.

When I hear bad things said about Christians, or Christianity, or Jesus, however, what is my first inclination? It is not often to leap with joy. I'm more likely, initially at least, to clench my teeth or start defending the faith. We should give an account of our faith, lovingly. Our response should not be to lash out in anger.

One of my main takeaways from this passage is that evil doesn't make sense. Evil has never and will never make sense. It isn't logical. Evil won't be deterred by silly things like facts. So rather than arguing with it, what might it look like to rejoice in the face of it?

I realize this newsletter will be distributed after February 29, but even so, you might reflect on the leaping in your life.

What makes you leap?

What makes you clench your fist?

Examine your life and ask yourself, is your leaping in line with the Lordship of Jesus? I pray your 2024 is full of abundant leaping for joy because Jesus is Lord!

It is a privilege being one of your pastors!


## WEDNESDAY NIGHTS & SPRING ACADEMY




#### Harmony


