

This summer i want to try to do some pastoral visits! I would like to have a cup of coffee and hang out. I can come to your place, or we can meet somewhere. It could be just with you or maybe your small group or Sunday School. To start our conversation, I'd like you to think about the historic John Wesley question "How is it with your soul?" and the follow up would be "How can I as your pastor help you in your relationship with God?"



On our recent trip, Laurel and I stopped at Newburyport, Massachusetts and saw the church where Rev George Whitefield, who along with Wesley furthered the Methodist movement. He died in the parsonage of Old South Presbyterian Church in Newburyport and was encrypted under the pulpit. Not sure I want that to happen, but Rev. Jim Noble is asking to be buried under the 11th Hour stage (LOL). Whitefield is credited with saying "We can preach the Gospel of Christ no further than we have experienced the power of it in our own hearts!"

The same is true for you in your daily life, you cannot serve God beyond the degree that you have experienced him in your life. My questions I asked above I pray will help us not

only get to know each other better, but both (or however many of us meet) grow closer to the power of God in our lives.

One of the Scriptures I referenced last Sunday is from II Corinthians 7:6-7 (CEB):

"However, God comforts people who are discouraged, and he comforted us by Titus' arrival. We weren't comforted only by his arrival but also by the comfort he had received from you. He told us about your desire to see me, how you were sorry, and about your concern for me, so that I was even happier."

Paul experiences tremendous ups and downs always, and as he travels and writes this letter. He practically prays without ceasing and knows God's providence is coming when times are hard.



The question I asked yesterday, and I ask again now, is what are YOU trying to handle (le) on your own and what are you willing to hand-El (El)? When we can hand things to El (the One true God), we don't have to carry those things any longer.

He is faithful and sends comfort at just the right time, just as Paul and those with him finally met Titus and received good news from

him about the Corinthians.

Friends, God will give you more than YOU can handle, but not more than you can hand-El! Pray today about what you're carrying that you can hand-El! Then, celebrate and await the glorious comfort and rest of God!




July 2024 Adult Sunday School Classes
