It was early into the Lighthouse Kid's Free Lunch program this summer, and that day we served sixty-eight children and parents.

I was walking around the Lighthouse and just crying with joy because three years of work (or more) and the vision was coming to fruition. About \$350,000 in repairs have been completed to the building from either personal donations or grants.

Methodist healthcare Ministry (MHM) has been a grant partner these last two years and this year funding our program.

The vision of the Lighthouse is to be a mission outpost of FMC and re-establishing a Methodist presence in the Lake View Highschool feeder area. It is also a goal to be more of a "one stop" where families or individuals can receive the services that are needed.

This year alone we have:

- Served over 1,800 meals
- Offered a four-week afterschool nutritional snack program
- Wesley Nurse services
- La Esperanza Mobile Clinic
- Referrals to eye appointments
- Partnered with the Northside Library
- Reading program and free books
- Children's Clothing Closet
- Food Pantry is now up and running and offers fresh vegetables from the "Bountiful Baskets" co-op program.
- Partners with Emmanuel Episcopal
- Partnered with St. Luke's volunteers
- Served teacher appreciation lunch to Goliad Elementary
- Sterling City Methodist Church provided boxes of cookies
- Partnered with Early Childhood Development
- Partnered with ASU Fostering Ram Success
- Partnered with Girl Scouts
- Partnered with Adult Literacy

Hello Church!

I am a person who likes clear glasses, clear windows, and a clear windshield. I know some of you can drive with a windshield that has not been cleaned since the Reagan administration and get along just fine. That is not necessarily a bad thing, it likely means you are more easy-going than I am.

But when it comes to spiritual vision, we ought to seek clarity. What "wipers", "wipes", "fluid", or "cloths" do we use to clarify our spiritual vision? Well, according to Paul, obedience is a big one. Obedience to what? Obedience to Scripture, the Holy Spirit, and God who has revealed God's self. In 2 Corinthians 10:6, Paul writes:

"Once your obedience is complete, we are ready to punish any disobedience."

What is Paul talking about? In my semi-educated opinion, he's writing to a church that has backslid. They've been entertaining far more sinful behavior and a far more sinful outlook on the world than they had when he left them approximately five years prior. His message to them is simple, obedience leads to clarity. He also tells them how obedience opens access to the most powerful weapons in the universe. If you drive with a caked-up windshield or smeared up glasses, it's ok. But may we all clean our spiritual vision!



REPORT FROM THE COSTA RICA TEAM & Guapiles Methodist Church

Situated in Northeast Costa Rica along the principal route from San Jose to the Caribbean Coast, Guapiles is a city of 50 K inhabitants. Years ago, The the Methodist Church acquired a 3 acre lot on the edge of the city. Worship services were initiated immediately using a "temporary" structure. Additional growth required the local congregation to expand this facility on multiple occasions. In 2018, plans were made for a permanent sanctuary and work began the same summer. Covid suspended the entire project, but in 2022, work once more resumed on the sanctuary. 2024 mission teams continued this much needed project with particular attention to the building of the walls. In addition to the manual labor, our team had the opportunity to worship with the local congregation and engage in VBS. Something new for Costa Ricans included was a good ol' traditional hot dog cookout with all the fixins' ... well mostly. Pickles and/or pickle relish are not customary in Costa Rica. The team not only invited the children to partake in crafts, food, and fellowship but families too! Costa Rica is now in our 2024 rear-view mirror but already in our 2025 windshield. From the first day of "Tell me what to do" to the last day of "I got this." We welcome and dread the last workday in the same breath. How do you leave with so much yet to be done? Matthew 7:14 "For the gate is small and the way is narrow that leads to life, and there are few who find it." Well, we can say we have found the gate!! Next year's plan started on the bus ride to the airport. Each year we don't think we can be any more humble but this place always proves us wrong. Until next year... Pura Vida! So much gratitude and thanks go out to our Church Family for financially and prayerfully supporting our team year in and year out.
