October has been Stewardship month and Pledge drive at our church for several years and so I write this October Newsletter approaching our theme from 1 Peter 4:10 " Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms."

Another translation reads "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace" (ESV). One Commentator, Grant Richison stated ""As" means to the degree that we received our gift. "As" sets up an analogy between the grace of **how** we received our gift and the grace of how we are to minister the gift. By grace, we received the gift, and it is by grace that we use the gift. We serve God because God gives, not because we earn the right to be used by God. God gave us our gift entirely by grace, and we minister it entirely by grace. "

A quick simple version "By grace you have received, by grace we give!"

Richison continued "The word "gift" derives from the same root as "grace," denoting something freely given, a favor bestowed. A gift is the capacity to **benefit** the body of Christ. The Christian cannot claim that this capacity came from himself. He cannot claim to produce this gift because it was a grace given by God. Our gifts belong to the purpose of God."

My friends, as we approach October and Stewardship Month, considering our giving and making a pledge for giving in 2025 I invite you to think about the both the gifts and the grace to which you have been given, and how you might offer gifts and grace for God's Kingdom work at First Methodist Church, San Angelo.

Consecration and Pledge Sunday will be on October 27th, 2024, and I would ask you begin praying right now for God to move in our midst in a mighty way.


From Nicolas Munongo (from the Democratic Republic of Congo) at the 2024 Convening General Conference of the GMC – Costa Rica 2024.

SENIOR ADULT MINISTRIES - ONE ANOTHER SHARING MINISTRY

Smog – and October

In the early 1970s my father accepted the call to a church in Riverside, California, and left behind the hot, sunny weather of Phoenix. To some, living in California might sound like you "Have Arrived!" – but not when you've arrived at Riverside!

As far as I could tell, that part of west Los Angeles only had two seasons of the year: October and Smog. In those days, the smog made it literally impossible to see more than 100 feet in front of you – on a 'moderate' day. It made you cry; they cancelled sporting events due to air quality; masks were available in most stores to filter the air; and children never knew that there were stars in the sky. The tall palm trees that lined the streets even seemed to bend over and cough on a regular basis.

Day after day we trudged through the ominous, suffocating haze until (in October!) those fabulous Santa Ana winds came. They blew with such velocity, you needed to hang on to all the cars in the parking lot en route to the front entrance of the stores.

After two days of the incessant winds, we were totally amazed to find that we were surrounded by gorgeous mountains! We were in a valley that was lined by spectacular peaks and ranges and astounding splendor.

In Psalm 125:2 it promises, "As the mountains surround Jerusalem, so the Lord surrounds His people, from this time forth and forever."

I'm well aware that there are days when we don't see God's work in our lives or even sense His presence surrounding us at all. It can begin with small doubts that blindside us with questions of "where are you God?" or "have You left me here to struggle all by myself?"

Usually nothing more has clouded our view of Christ than the gradual mounting of routine, predictable situations in our lives. Then suddenly we are up to our necks, trying just to stay above the foray until we realize we've been unsuccessfully trying to cope all by ourselves – without looking to the One whose power and presence are ever available.

Like the mountains that surround Jerusalem (or your current hazy challenges), God's arms of love surround us – whether we can see Him or not. God's Word is filled with neverfailing promises. He is faithfully surrounding you – and He hasn't moved!

There is a stabilizing comfort when we are in the valley just to realize Whose arms make the mountains!






