Wait! Are you sitting down?

For the Advent Sermon Series, I'll be using Old Testament (O.T.) passages selected from the **Revised Common Lectionary** (RCL), Year C, which begins the seasonal year December 1st, 2024.

This is uncommon for me, as I usually have been preaching a series or messages drawn from the text, but not in the Lectionary Cycle. When I looked at these Old Testament passages, they began to richly speak to me, so I created my Advent series from there.

I invite you to come along on this journey to Christmas as we explore O.T. passages that will prophesy and point us toward the coming Messiah. Begin by studying the text and asking what the message is God would speak to you this Advent/Christmas season.

1st Advent - December 1st "The Days are Surely Coming!" Jeremiah 33:14-16 2nd Advent - December 8th "Are You ready for Divine Arrival?" Malachi 3:1-4 3rd Advent - December 15th "He Will Renew you!' Zephaniah 3:14-20 4th Advent - December 22nd "From Grim View to Hope is Born" Micah 5:2-5a

Christmas Eve – December 24th "In the Land of Darkness – Comes Light!" Isaiah 9:2-7 Sunday After – December 29th "The Heart of a Parent" 1 Samuel 2:18-20, 26 Epiphany – January 5th, 2025 "Nations Shall Come to your Light!" Isaiah 60:1-5

As we explore the ancient text together, I pray God will stir in you the hope of a message of prophecy, one that speaks thousands of years ago, fulfilled in Jesus, but still alive and speaking to us today!

Truthfully, I was probably a tad too old anyway. I remember, though, they asked me a question along the lines of, "Where do you see your ministry in ten years?" I answered that I had not experienced God working on a detailed ten-year plan. A year or two, often, it seems. I am not sure they liked my answer, but I is true.

When I came onto the staff here at First, I had no intentions of transitioning off. Yet, God has prepared me for such a time as this. His plans are higher and better than mine. When our plans fall through, God is still on the throne and working for us. If we are open and thankful, there is no telling what might come along. God help me if I ever think I have "arrived." We are blessed and the promises of God are fully in effect for me and for each one of you. Thank you again for the privilege of being on staff here, if only for a season. But I have no plans to go anywhere anytime soon! I'm thankful to still be among all of you precious people.


