
The Journey Class is currently studying Revelation led by David Huckaby.

NEW OUTREACH PROGRAM FOR FIRST CHURCH - OHI

Open Homes Initiative is a local organization that has partnered with several local churches in an effort to grow and support foster families in San Angelo. It is led by local pastor and foster parent, Justin Smith. By partnering with OHI, First Methodist will not only offer support for existing foster families, but also assist in recruitment of new foster families. Support will be offered through Foster 360, First Methodist's volunteer group, along with the volunteer groups of other partnering churches.

Research shows that over 50% of licensed families drop their license within the first year. However, when those families are supported by the faith community, over 90% of licensed families retain licensing and continue to foster long term. OHI offers support through church volunteer groups, monthly support groups, and increasing community awareness. Over 70% of foster children in San Angelo are placed outside our county and some are placed out of state, due to the shortage of foster homes here in San Angelo. OHI hopes to make positive and long-lasting changes for foster children in our community by helping to ensure a safe and loving home is available for each child. A few spots are available for the watercolor workshop. \$395 per workshop includes lunch. Basic knowledge of the medium is important.


