Sabbath is soon in our today's world, even though the Hebrew writer wrote (Hebrews 4:9-11) "There remains, then, a Sabbath-rest for the people of God; for anyone who enters God's rest also rests from their works, just as God did from his. Let us, therefore, make every effort to enter that rest, so that no one will perish by following their example of disobedience." As you read this, I'm not only thinking of Sabbath rest, but sabbatical.

One of the historic Wesleyan questions is about the difference between leisure time and sabbath. I think we can all get caught up on trying to figure that out. "Many pastors have a day off and think that's their Sabbath." Eugene Peterson calls a day off a "bastard Sabbath." He says Sabbath is not a free day to do errands or go on vacation — it is a special time devoted to "pray and play" with Jesus." (1) In other words, a day off, is not a restful time with God, and few pastors, and even fewer parishioners take it. I am personally needing to find Sabbath.

Bill Gaultiere writes "Sabbaticals work like Sabbaths except that by setting aside a few weeks — or better yet a few months! — for Sabbath rest we are able to dramatically disconnect from life and work as usual and explore who we are at their core and bring ourselves more fully to God and his call upon our lives." (1)

I last took a Sabbatical in 2004 after seven years in Junction, and twenty years later I'm nearly completing my eighth year at San Angelo First. I see similarities, except the last few years have been hard with lots of decisions that have had to be made. I feel it's time.

My Sabbatical will have some leisure, some earnest prayer and play with Jesus. I am going to be working on a collection of faith stories I hope to do something with; I hope to shovel some snow, and the dogs might find a walk in the mountains refreshing. Laurel will probably find me underfoot. I am praying for the quiet time of sabbatical. Before I go, I have been trying to get everything in order. Gaultiere speaks of this overworking before the retreat as also being harmful, but unfortunately, I find it necessary.

Says Gaultiere, "But in the Biblical tradition, before the Sabbath there is a *Preparation Day* to get ready for your day of rest and renewal and after the Sabbath there is an evening which is meant to be a restful transition time before you begin the work week." (1)

For now, I believe I'm prepared, but I also look towards the evening in which I will transition back to be with you. Hold down the fort!


